



## Term Employment Opportunity as T'aaq-wiihak Fisheries Manager

The Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council (NTC) is seeking a motivated and skilled individual to fill a term (0.8 time) maternity leave opportunity beginning January 15, 2018. This position oversees all aspects of the implementation of the five Nations' rights-based commercial fisheries. Based out of Tofino, the position requires frequent travel on Vancouver Island and other locations in Canada as required.

**Job Overview:** The T'aaq-wiihak Fisheries Manager works primarily with five Nuu-chah-nulth Nations (Ahousaht, Ehattesaht, Hesquiaht, Mowachaht/Muchalaht, and Tla-o-qui-aht) to coordinate the development and implementation of the Nations' rights-based commercial fisheries. The T'aaq-wiihak Fisheries Manager is the primary contact between the five Nations and DFO for collective fisheries implementation tasks.

### Required Qualifications and Experience

- Post-secondary degree in biology, resource management, environmental studies or a closely related discipline.
- Five years of relevant management experience, including fisheries-related project management, employee supervision and program administration.
- Understanding of fishery issues, policies and legislation affecting B.C. First Nations, primarily the five Nations' constitutional right to fish and shell fish.
- Experience working with First Nations and ability to function in a cross-cultural environment.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Strong working knowledge with Microsoft Office, Word and Excel software.
- Experience speaking and presenting to diverse audiences and facilitation of meetings.
- A valid driver's license and access to a reliable vehicle.
