I am incredibly thankful for the support of my family, and am looking forward to doing everything I can during my term.




#### **Clifford Charles: Legislative Councillor**

## Regina Frank: Legislative & Executive Councillor


I am Regina Frank, I am proud to be from the Rush families. My mother is Gloria Frank (Rush) and my father was late John O. Frank of Ahousaht.
