

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## **PART 1 - INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS**

### **Short title**

- 1.1** This regulation may be cited as the Offence Penalty Regulation, UTR 45/2026.

### **Application**

- 1.2** This regulation prescribes, for the purposes of section 10.4(a) of the Act, penalties and discounted penalties in respect of various offences.

### **Definitions**

- 1.3** In this regulation,

“Act” means the Administration of Justice Act, UTS 75/2025.



## PART 2 - PENALTIES AND REPEAT OFFENCES

### Penalties and discounted penalties

- 2.1** (a) For each offence listed in Column A of Schedule 1 and described in Column 2 of Schedule 1,
- (i) Column C of Schedule 1 prescribes the penalty, and
  - (ii) Column D of Schedule 1 prescribes the discounted penalty.
- (b) The notes listed in Schedule 1 are included for reference purposes only and do not form part of the regulation.

### Repeat offences

- 2.2** A person who commits an offence more than once is liable, for each subsequent offence, to
- (a) a penalty in an amount that is up to twice the amount specified for that offence in Column C of Schedule 1, or
  - (b) a discounted penalty in an amount that is up to twice the amount specified for that offence in Column D of Schedule 1.
